## Foundational Lessons from Genesis 1-4

- I. Intro.
  - A. A worldview is like a box top to a puzzle
  - B. *If a worldview was (to switch metaphors) a house,* Genesis is the foundation which the house is built on, and Genesis 1-4 are like the footers of the foundation the part that bears the weight of the building.

## II. Foundations

- A. Foundation 1 Who God is: God created everything that exists and is the rightful king and owner of all.
  - 1. **God is Powerful** (Gen 1:3, 6, 9, 11, 14, 20, 24, 26; see also Ps. 19)
  - **2.** God is Sovereign (Acts 4:24, 17:24-25)
  - **3.** God is Good (Gen. 1:4, 10, 12, 18, 21, 25, 31; 2:16)
- B. Foundation 2 Who we are: Man and woman are the pinnacle of creation and made in the image of God. Marriage is designed as the foundation of human society.
  - 1. Image of God (Genesis 1:26-27)
  - 2. Man and Woman (Genesis 1:27)
  - 3. Marriage (Genesis 2:22-24, see also Matt. 19:4-5)
- C. Foundation 3 What is wrong with us and the world?
  - 1. The entrance of sin into the world Genesis 3:1-8
  - 2. **Consequences of sin** the curse Gen 3:14-19
- D. Foundation 4- Where are we going? (promise of a savior)
  - i. Hope is not lost though
    - 1. God doesn't kill them immediately, rather he clothes them (Gen 3:21)
    - 2. Eve named "mother of living" (3:20)
    - 3. Seth given to replace Abel (4:25)
  - ii. Promise of a savior (Gen 3:15; see also Rom. 16:20, Gal. 4:4, Heb. 2:14-15)
