

# **COVID-19 Reopening Plan FAQ's**

## **Why do people need to sign up ahead of time to attend service?**

This allows us to accommodate as many people as we can while maintaining some level of distancing.

## **Will we pass an offering plate?**

Not at this time. We encourage you to mail checks (425 McDaniel Street, Tallahassee, FL 32303) or to give online ([gcot.org/giving](https://gcot.org/giving)). We will provide offering plates near the exit of each room for those who want to give in person.

## **Will we practice communion?**

Yes, on the first Sunday of each month. Each person who participates will grab one set of cups. The top cup will have the juice and the cup it is resting in will have the bread.

## **Will you hand out bulletins?**

## **What is the plan for sanitizing the building?**

The security team disinfects all “high-touch” areas before each service. While we are striving to provide a healthy environment living in a fallen world means risk is always present.

This is a great place for those with young children to sit (it allows you to hem your kids in at a table and gives them a place for drawing etc.).
