## Session One: Creation of Humanity in the Image of God

- I. Creator-Creature Relationship Manifest in the Creation of Man and Woman
  - A. God eternity, aseity, independence, owner, ruler (Ps 50; Isa 40; Acts 17:24-25)
    - 1. Creation displays the aseity (self-existence), self-sufficiency, independence of God
    - 2. Creation displays God's rightful ownership of and Rulership over all he has made
    - 3. Therefore, God does not need the creation he has made, in whole or in part. Creation displays his glory but does not/cannot contribute to his infinite worth
  - B. Humans temporal, contingent, dependent, owned, ruled (Acts 17:25; 1 Cor 10:31)
    - 1. Humans, in contrast, are dependent upon God for all that they are and have
    - 2. Humans, likewise, are under the rightful Lordship and Rulership of God
    - 3. Therefore, humans have only one rightful stance before God humility, dependence, gratitude, obedience, loyalty. To express otherwise is treason!
    - 4. Humans were not created to fill some emptiness in God but to be filled up by God!
- II. Man and woman created as the first human pair and in the image of God
  - A. First human pair the Bible's insistence upon the historical Adam and Eve
    - 1. The Genesis account presents the creation of Adam and Eve as historical
    - 2. Both Jesus and Paul understand Gen 2-3 as historical. See esp. 1 Tm 2 and 1 Cor 11
    - 3. The redemptive-historical storyline of Scripture depends on this historicity

- B. Image of God in "being" and "doing," reflecting and representing God (Gen 1:26-28)
  - 1. The pinnacle of God's creative work is seen in the creation of man as male and female
  - 2. Image of God has to do both with who God made us to be and what he called us to do
  - 3. Christ, the image of God paradigmatically shows what image of God truly is
  - 4. True human flourishing is expressed in life that fulfills God's created purpose

## III. Man and woman created equal in essence and distinct in roles

- A. Equal in essence both fully human, fully image of God, equal worth and dignity
  - 1. Gen 1 makes clear both male and female are created by God in his image
  - 2. So, equal dignity, worth, value, and honor attaches to man and woman
  - 3. Christian men in particular need to see the nobility of women, wives in particular
- B. Distinct in roles male headship established in creation for marriage and church
  - 1. Following the pattern of the Trinity, God creates male and female equal in essence but distinct in roles
  - 2. That distinction includes male authority in realms of believing community and home
  - 3. Marriage: union of a man and a woman, for life, reflecting Christ and the church.
  - 4. Gender: only two biological sexes and therefore only two genders. Our self-identity is given by God, not constructed by us.
